With ride sharing, there is no need to build new services because people are more than willing to pay someone else to take them where they need to go. NYT columnist Farhad Manjoo says that ride sharing services are "hollowing out" the taxi industry. According to Manjoo, there are more Uber drivers than yellow cabs in New York City, and the taxi industry is hemorrhaging customers. "The truth is that today you can get into a taxi pretty easily," says Manjoo. "If you're willing to wait 20 minutes on a Friday night, you can usually find a car." The same is not true for ride sharing services. 2) It creates congestion-urban-transit/# Uber has created congested traffic in cities around the world. Uber is currently operating in 30 cities across the United States, but the company has grown to become one of the largest taxi companies in the world. The company operates regularly scheduled trips that travel on fixed routes instead of each driver responding to demand. When Uber is not operating, many of its cars are usually parked on streets, further adding to traffic problems.
